

MUSIC TEACHERS REGISTRATION AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE Music Teachers Registration Act 1928 provides for New Zealand to be divided into the Auckland, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago districts for the purposes of the election of the members of the Music Teachers Registration Board. This Bill provides that the Provincial Districts of Marlborough and Nelson shall be included in the Canterbury district instead of in the Wellington district.

1. Short Title.	

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Music Teachers Registration Act 1928. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Music Teachers Registration Amendment Act 1953, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Music Teachers Registration Act 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

2. Subsection four of section three of the principal Act is hereby amended— Constitution of districts represented on Music Teachers Registration Board.

(a) By omitting from paragraph (b) the words "Hawke's Bay, Marlborough, and Nelson", and substituting the words "and Hawke's Bay":

(b) By inserting in paragraph (c), after the word "Canterbury", the words "Marlborough, Nelson".
