A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to authorize the granting of the Maori War Medal to all Title.  
Soldiers who took part therein.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand  
5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Maori War Medal Act, 1917. Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in Part III of the Maori War Medal.  
Pensions Act, 1913, or in any regulations made thereunder, any  
10 person (or the heir-at-law of any deceased person) who served under  
the Crown in any of the Maori wars in such a manner and form as  
would have entitled him to receive the Maori War pension if he had  
also been under fire shall be entitled to receive the Maori War Medal  
without any pension.

15 3. Paragraph (a) of section twenty-four of the said Pension Act Amendment.  
shall not apply to any application under this Act.

4. Save as herein excepted the regulations now in force for Application of  
regulating the application for, the evidence in support of, and the regulations.  
grant of Maori War pensions shall apply to the award of all medals  
20 under this Act, with the exception that it shall not be necessary to  
give proof that the applicant or the person in respect of whose  
services the application is made was ever under fire.
