A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT in Settlement of certain Claims to Land of Naval and Title. Military Settlers and Volunteers, and for the further investigation of other such Claims.

WHEREAS under the authority conferred in the first paragraph of the Preamble. First Schedule of "The Special Powers and Contracts Act, 1886," the Governor did appoint a Commission to inquire into and report upon all claims to land made by Volunteers enrolled between the years

- one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three and one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, which were barred by section three of "The Waste Lands Administration Act, 1876," with the view, in accordance with a report of the Waste Lands Committee of the House of Representatives, dated the tenth day of June, one thousand eight 10 hundred and eighty-six, of restoring their rights to all those men
- enrolled before the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, who subsequently, by continuous service, completed their five years as efficient Volunteers:
- And whereas the aforesaid Waste Lands Committee, by another 15 report dated the twenty-second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, did express their opinion that the claims to land of the naval and military settlers, if entertained at all, should, in the first instance, be inquired into and reported upon by the Government; and the Governor, in accordance with the last-
- 20 mentioned report, did direct the Commissioners appointed under the aforesaid Commission to inquire into and report upon all the claims to land of the naval and military settlers accordingly:

And whereas the aforesaid Commissioners have reported to the Governor that, having inquired into the claims of one thousand six No. 111-2.

hundred Naval and Military settlers and Volunteers, they found that only the several persons mentioned in the *First* Schedule to this Act had respectively substantiated such claims, and to the extent in the said Schedule expressed :

And whereas subsequent to the said report, further evidence has 5 been adduced by or on behalf of the persons mentioned in the Second Schedule in substantiation of their claims, and the same have been proved to the satisfaction of the Defence Minister to the extent in the said Schedule mentioned:

And whereas, by the enactment hereinabove first recited, it is 10 provided that all claims recommended by the aforesaid Commissioners should be paid in cash, and it is expedient that the Governor should be authorized to satisfy any of such claims by the issue of certificates for remission of money in the purchase of land, in lieu of cash :

And whereas certain naval and military settlers retired from Her 15 Majesty's service with a view to settle in the colony after the repeal of the provisions conferring the privileges of land orders in such cases, but in ignorance of such repeal at the time of their retirement, and it is equitable that they should have special consideration :

And whereas also the Commissioners hereinabove mentioned were 20 limited by the terms of their Commission to report upon all claims submitted to them in strict justice, and were unable to make any recommendation in favour of persons who had forfeited their claims through some act of forgetfulness or misapprehension of the law, and it is equitable to afford such persons relief, and for such purpose it is 25 fitting that a new Commission should be issued, with power to report equitably on the merits of all claims submitted to it :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Naval and Military Settlers' and Volunteers' Land Act, 1887."

2. The Governor may grant to the several persons mentioned in the *First* and *Second* Schedules to this Act certificates entitling them respectively to the remission of money in the purchase of land in any 35 part of the colony as shall not exceed the sums specified in the said Schedules, and set opposite the names of the aforesaid persons respectively.

3. Every certificate of remission of money in purchase of land which is issued under the authority of the *last-preceding* section of 40this Act shall be barred unless exercised on or before the thirty-first day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

4. Notwithstanding anything in this Act contained, the Governor may issue a Crown grant of the land specified in the First Schedule hereto to Charles Andrews, a member of the Second Regiment of the 45 Waikato Militia, in respect of his services in such regiment, the said services having been proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners aforesaid.

5. The Governor may appoint one or more Commissioners in terms of "The Commissioners' Powers Act, 1867," to inquire according 50 of persons equitably to equity and good conscience into and to report-

thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, retired from Her Majesty's service, with a view to settling in New Zealand, and of obtaining grants of land therein in ignorance at the time of their retirement that the authority to make grants of land in such cases had been repealed; and

(2.) Upon claims of officers and Militiamen who at any time before the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, may have bona fide rendered active service and been actually engaged with the Queen's enemies, as required by "The Volunteers' Land Act, 1865," to entitle them to remission certificates for the purchase of land in respect of such service; and

(3.) Upon claims of Volunteers enrolled before the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventysix, who may have bona fide rendered the services required under "The Volunteers' Land Act, 1865," notwithstanding the repeal thereof, to entitle them to remission certificates for the purchase of land in respect of such services.

And by such Commission the Governor may require the Com-20missioners specially to report whether any such persons are equitably entitled to relief, or have bona fide retired from Her Majesty's service, or have actually rendered the service entitling them to land, but have vitiated the claim through some technicality or non-observance of the 25 conditions attached thereto, or the making thereof.

6. Any claim that may be recommended by such Commissioners may, notwithstanding any informality therein, be approved by the Governor in Council, and thereupon shall be satisfied by the issue of a certificate for the remission of money in the purchase of land in any 30 part of the colony, at the rate following, that is to say :---

(1.) In respect of naval and military settlers—

To any commissioned officer for any sum not exceeding two hundred pounds;

To any non-commissioned or warrant officer for any sum not exceeding forty pounds;

To any private soldier, marine, or seaman for any sum not exceeding thirty pounds.

(2.) In respect of Volunteers and Officers and Militiamen at the rate mentioned in "The Volunteers' Land Act, 1865," notwithstanding the repeal of the said Act:

Provided that no person shall be entitled to be recommended for any scrip or certificate for remission of money under this and the lastpreceding section, who has already received any land or other consideration in payment of the particular service in respect whereof his 45 claim is made under this Act.

7. Every certificate issued under the last-preceding section shall Certificate void if be absolutely barred if not exercised before the expiration of three not exercised within three years. years from the date of a Gazette notice declaring the certificate to be ready for issue and delivery to the person entitled thereto.

8. In case of the death of any person heretofore found entitled, In case of death or who may hereafter be found entitled, to a certificate of remission of to persons best money under this Act, the Governor, by Order in Council, may direct entitled thereto. such certificate to be issued to such person or persons as he shall think

most equitably entitled thereto, or in any manner he shall think best on behalf of any such person or persons.

Every certificate issued in accordance with any such Order in Council shall be in full discharge to Her Majesty of all claims of the deceased person, and of all persons claiming through him for land or remission of money in the purchase of land in respect of any services referred to in this Act, rendered by the deceased to Her Majesty.

Claims may be satisfied in cash.

Schedules.

9. In any case in which the Commissioners have recommended, or shall hereafter recommend any such claim as aforesaid, the Governor may, if he think fit, with the consent in writing of the 10 claimant, pay to such claimant in cash a sum not exceeding fifty per centum of the nominal value of the remission certificate to which he is entitled in full satisfaction of his claim, and in lieu of issuing a certificate as provided by section six hereof, and all payments shall be made out of and be charged against the Land Fund.
