## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to repeal the Twenty-eighth Section of "The Title. Protection of Animals Act, 1873," and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

THEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Preamble. Protection of Animals Act, 1873," it was enacted in the twenty-eighth section of the said Act that certain animals were not to be introduced into the Colony of New Zealand: And whereas it is 5 desirable to repeal the said twenty-eighth section of the said Act for the purpose of extending the provisions of the same:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Noxious Animals Short Title. 10 Prohibition Act, 1876."

2. The twenty-eighth section of the said Act intituled "The Repeal of 28th section of Animals Act, 1873," is hereby repealed.

3. In lieu of the said section the following provisions shall Act, 1873." Protection of Animals Act, 1873," is hereby repealed.

15 henceforth be in force:

It shall not be lawful for any person to introduce any fox, polecat, stoat, weasel, venomous reptile, hawk, vulture or other bird of prey into the colony, or to liberate or allow to go at large any polecat, stoat, weasel, venomous reptile, hawk, vulture or other bird 20 of prey which may have already been introduced, or to have any fox, polecat, stoat, weasel, venomous reptile, hawk, vulture or other bird of prey not indigenous to the colony in his possession; and every person offending against any of the above provisions shall be liable, on conviction before any two Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding

30 one hundred pounds, and in default of payment to be imprisoned for a period of not more than six months. Notwithstanding anything in Proviso. this Act, it shall be lawful to keep ferrets.
