A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to give Equal Rights to all Descendants of Natives in New Zealand. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Native Descendants Act, 1881." Short Title.

5 2. From and after the passing of this Act, and saving as to estates or interests vested, or to rights actually acquired, or proceedings completed or commenced at the time of the passing of this Act, the expression "Native" shall, in construing any Act or Acts now or hereafter in force, mean an aboriginal native of the Colony of New Zealand, and shall include all half-castes and all their descendants. Interpretation of "Native."
