A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to appropriate a certain Portion of the Town Belt of Dunedin to and for the Purposes of a Public Cemetery. Title.

WHEREAS by a certain Crown grant bearing date on or about the sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, registered in the Deeds Registry Office at Dunedin, in the Provincial District of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, as No. 11261, Her Majesty the Queen did grant unto the Superintendent of the Province of Otago and his successors Superintendents of the said province all that the parcel of land and hereditaments called or known as "the Town Belt of Dunedin," as the same is more particularly described in the said Crown grant, with all the rights and appurtenances thereunto belonging, to hold unto the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago and his successors in trust, for the purposes of public recreation, for the Town of Dunedin and its inhabitants: And whereas by virtue of "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," the said parcel of land and hereditaments became, on the abolition thereby effected of the said Province of Otago, vested in Her said Majesty for the same purposes and objects and subject to the same powers and conditions as those for and subject to which the same parcel of land and hereditaments were then held by the said Superintendent: And whereas by virtue of "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," it was enacted, amongst other things, that all public reserves theretofore granted to any Superintendent, and which became vested in Her Majesty under the provisions of "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," might be

granted to or vested in any governing body, trustees, or other persons respectively for the specific purpose for which such reserves were made: And whereas by a deed bearing date on or about the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and made between Her said Majesty of the one part and the Corporation of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Dunedin of the other part, Her said Majesty, by virtue of the powers and provisions of "The Public Reserves Act, 1877," and of all and every other the powers and authorities in anywise enabling her in that behalf, did grant to and vest in the said Corporation all that the said parcel of land and hereditaments called or known as the Town Belt of Dunedin, as the same parcel of land and hereditaments are described in the Schedule thereunder written, together with the rights and appurtenances thereunto belonging, to hold the said parcel of land and hereditaments unto the said Corporation in trust, for the purposes of public recreation, for the City of Dunedin and its inhabitants: And whereas it is expedient to appropriate and set apart for the purposes of a public cemetery the portion of the said Town Belt of Dunedin which is described in the Schedule to this Act, in order that the same may form an extension of the present North Dunedin Cemetery:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The North Dunedin Cemetery Extension Act, 1891."

Part of Town Belt of Dunedin set apart for public cemetery.

2. All that part of the said Town Belt of Dunedin which is described in the said Schedule hereto is hereby appropriated and set apart and shall henceforth be used exclusively for the purposes of a public cemetery for the interment of the dead, and shall be deemed to form and shall form from the passing of this Act a part of the existing cemetery originally appropriated and set apart by "The North Dunedin Cemetery Act, 1872."

Trustees.

3. The Council for the time being of the City of Dunedin shall be and shall as from the date of the passing of "The North Dunedin Cemetery Act, 1872," be deemed to have been the Trustees of the cemetery by the said Act constituted, and to have been continued in office by virtue of "The Cemeteries Act, 1882," and shall continue to be the Trustees of such cemetery as hereby enlarged.

Vesting.

4. The said cemetery shall nevertheless, as from the passing of "The North Dunedin Cemetery Act, 1872," be deemed to have been vested and shall be vested in the Corporation of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Dunedin.

Provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1882," incorporated herewith.

5. The provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1882," and "The Cemeteries Act 1882 Amendment Act, 1885," and all amendments of either of the said Acts, so far as the same or any of them are applicable or may be applied to the management of public cemeteries by local bodies, shall be deemed to be incorporated with and to form part of this Act.

Regulations and fees declared valid for enlarged cemetery.

6. The regulations and the scale of fees heretofore in use in connection with the said cemetery shall be deemed to be valid regulations of and a valid scale of fees applicable to the cemetery as hereby

enlarged, but shall be subject to be revised and altered as if made under "The Cemeteries Act, 1882."

SCHEDULE.

Schedule.

ALL that parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago and Colony of New Zealand containing by admeasurement 13 acres 2 roods 9 perches, more or less, being part of the Town Belt of the City of Dunedin. Bounded and admeasured as follows: by a line commencing at a point on the east-south-eastern boundary of the said Town Belt, distant in a south-south-westerly direction along the said boundary 919 links from the east-north-eastern angle of the said Town Belt; and proceeding thence by a line in a south-south-westerly direction along the said east-south-eastern boundary of the said Town Belt bearing $201^{\circ} 38' 42''$, 1216.3 links, to the easternmost corner of the present cemetery; thence in a west-north-westerly direction along the boundary of the present cemetery bearing $291^{\circ} 38' 42''$ 719 links; thence in a north-north-easterly direction along the boundary of the present cemetery bearing $21^{\circ} 38' 42''$, 700 links; thence again in a west-north-westerly direction along the boundary of the present cemetery bearing $291^{\circ} 38' 42''$ to the northernmost corner of the present cemetery, 996 links; thence again in a north-north-easterly direction along a line bearing north $21^{\circ} 38' 42''$ east, 309 links; thence in an east-north-easterly direction along a line bearing north, $78^{\circ} 17' 30''$ east, 377.4 links; and thence in an east-south-easterly direction along a line bearing south $68^{\circ} 21' 18''$ east, $111^{\circ} 38' 42''$, 1400 links to the commencing point of commencement.
