A BILL INTITULED

An Acr to amend the Nurses Registration Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Nurses Registration Short Title. Amendment Act, 1920, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Nurses Registration Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. (1.) Subsection two of section four of the principal Act is Qualification of hereby repealed, and the following subsections substituted therefor: _____persons who may be

"(2.) Every person who has attained the age of twenty-one years shall on payment of a fee of one pound be entitled to registration as a nurse who satisfies the Registrar—

"(a.) That she has had not less than three years' approved training as a nurse; and

"(b.) That she has received an approved course of instruction in theoretical and practical nursing; and

"(c.) That she has passed an examination for nurses under this

"(2a.) For the purposes of this section the expression—

"'Approved training as a nurse' means a prescribed course of training in a hospital approved for the purpose by the Registrar:

"'An approved course of instruction' means a course of instruction provided at a hospital approved by the Registrar as a training-school for nurses."

(2.) Subsection one of section four of the principal Act is hereby Repeals. repealed.

(3.) Section five of the principal Act is hereby repealed.

3. Section six of the principal Act is hereby amended by Nurses' badges to be omitting the words "together with," and substituting the words issued only to "and in the case of a nurse trained in New Zealand shall also New Zealand." receive."
