## A BILL INTITULED

An Acr to establish and define an Ensign and also Code Signal Title. Flags for New Zealand.

#### New.

WHEREAS, by Proclamation under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, dated the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, it was declared, in accordance with the Queen's regulations made under the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament intituled "The Colonial Defence Act, 1865," 10 that the flag hereinafter described should have the distinctive seal or badge of the Colony of New Zealand for all vessels belonging to, or permanently employed in, the service of the colony: And whereas the said flag has since been in general use for the purpose aforesaid, and also as the recognised ensign of the colony: And whereas it is

15 desirable that the same flag should be by law established as the ensign of the colony for all purposes: BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in

Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

20 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The New Zealand Ensign Short Title. and-Code Signals Act, 1900."

2. There is hereby established an ensign to be called the "New New Zealand ensign Zealand Ensign."

3. The New Zealand ensign shall be the blue ensign of Her Description of 25 Majesty's fleet, the Royal Naval Reserve, having on the fly thereof the ensign. Southern Cross as represented by four five-pointed red stars with white borders.

Code signal flags established.

4. There also hereby established code signal flags are follows :-

(1.) The code signal flag for ships registered in New Zealand and belonging to or permanently employed by the New Zealand Government shall be the blue ensign of Her Majesty's fleet with a white disc on the fly thereof containing the Southern Cross as represented by four fivepointed red stars.

5

(2.) The code signal flag for merchant ships registered in New Zealand shall be the red ensign of Her Majesty's fleet with a white disc on the fly thereof containing the Southern Cross as represented by four five-pointed red stars.

Penalty for defacing ensign or flag.

5. Every person who defaces the New Zealand ensign ex any code signal flag by placing any sign, representation, or letter 15 thereon, or (in the ease of the code signal flag for ships) by altering the disc or its contents, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

five pounds.

Act reserved.

6. This Act shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Gazette: Provided that such Proclamation shall not be made unless it contains a statement that Her Majesty has been pleased to approve of this Act.
