A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the New Zealand Society of Accountants Act, 1908. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the New Zealand Society of Accountants Amendment Act, 1915, and shall form part of and be read together with the New Zealand Society of Accountants Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

2. Section thirty of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding the following as subsection five thereof:— Provision for reinstatement of members whose names have been removed from register.

“(5.) Any member whose name is so removed from the register may, at any time after the period of twelve months from the date when notice thereof is so delivered or posted to him, apply to the Council for reinstatement as a member of the society. The Council may, if it thinks fit, grant such reinstatement upon such terms and subject to such conditions as the Council may impose, and may direct that the name of such member be restored to the register. The member shall, upon such restoration, be deemed to have been readmitted as a member of the society.”
