ORCHARD-TAX AMENDMENT BILL.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM.

CLAUSE 2: Under the Orchard-tax Act, 1927, an orchard-tax at the rate of 1s. an acre is imposed for the general purposes of the fruitgrowing industry; in addition a special tax not exceeding 5s. an acre is imposed in commercial fruitgrowing districts to provide funds for protection against fireblight. As fireblight does not attack citrus or stone fruits, it is considered inequitable to charge with special orchard-tax those orchards in which such fruits are exclusively grown, or, in the case of mixed orchards, to charge with special orchard-tax those areas that are used exclusively for the production of citrus or stone fruits. The purpose of this clause is to exempt such orchards and areas accordingly by limiting the incidence of the special orchard-tax to areas planted with the kinds of fruit-trees specified in the clause.

Clause 3: This clause makes provision for payment out of the proceeds of the fireblight tax of fees in respect of their services to members of any Fireblight Committee.

This Public Bill originated in the House of Repre-SENTATIVES, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.
