## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Orchard-tax Act, 1927.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority

5 of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Orchard-tax Short Title. Amendment Act, 1934-35, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Orchard-tax Act, 1927 See Reprint (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Section three of the principal Act is hereby amended by omitting the words "one shilling", and substituting the words "two shillings".

Increasing the rate of general orchard-tax.

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in Postponing due section five of the principal Act, the general orchard-tax date of payment 15 imposed by section three of that Act and payable for orchard-tax for the year nineteen hundred and thirty-five shall become current year. due and payable on the first day of April in that year.

4. Section seven of the principal Act is hereby repealed, Application of and the following section substituted therefor:

"7. The residue of the tax received for any year orchard-tax. pursuant to section three hereof, after making the deduction provided for in the last preceding section, shall be applied as follows:-
