A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Ocean Beach Public Domain Act, 1892, and Title. the Ocean Beach Public Domain Act 1892 Amendment Act, 1901.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Ocean Beach Public Domain short Title. Amendment Act, 1920, and it shall form part of and be read together 10 with the Ocean Beach Public Domain Act, 1892, and the Acts amending the same.

2. In this Act, if not inconsistent with the context,—

"The principal Act" means the Ocean Beach Public Domain Act, 1892:

"The Amendment Act, 1901," means the Ocean Beach Public Domain Act 1892 Amendment Act, 1901.

3. Section twenty-eight of the principal Act is hereby amended Amendment of by repealing the word "June," and substituting therefor the word section 28 of principal Act. "August."

4. (1.) Section eighteen of the Amendment Act, 1901, is hereby Contribution of 1d. repealed.

(2.) The Board may year by year requisition from the Dunedin City Council and the St. Kilda Borough Council respectively a sum not exceeding one farthing in the pound on the annual value 25 of the rateable property in the borough represented by such Councils

respectively. (3.) Such requisition shall be made by a resolution of the Board, and shall be notified to the said Councils respectively by a demand in the form in the Schedule hereto signed by the Secretary of the

(4.) If and whenever a demand shall be served upon either of the said Councils the amount thereof shall constitute a debt by such Council or the corporate body which it represents to the Board, and may be recovered in manner provided by section twenty-nine of the principal Act, which section shall, mutatis mutandis, apply to such demand and the amount thereof.

(5.) The requisition and demand may, for the year nineteen hundred and twenty, be made as soon as may be after the passing of this Act, and in each subsequent year shall be made before the first day of August in that year.

(6.) A demand signed as aforesaid shall be deemed conclusive evidence that all conditions precedent to the making thereof have been fulfilled, and that the said Secretary was duly authorized to sign and make the same.

5. (1.) It shall be lawful for the Dunedin City Council and the 15 St. Kilda Borongh Council respectively from time to time, and either annually or otherwise, to contribute to the funds of the Board, in addition to the amounts which the Board is authorized to levy as aforesaid, such sum or sums of money as such Councils may respectively deem proper.

(2:) All sums of money which shall prior to the passing of this Act have been contributed to the Board by the said Councils respectively shall be deemed to have been lawfully contributed.

6. The moneys obtained by the Board pursuant to the preceding section shall be applied by the Board as revenues for the attainment 25 of all or any of the objects of its incorporation.

7. Section seventeen of the Amendment Act, 1901, is hereby amended by repealing the words "three farthings," and substituting therefor the words "five-eighths of a penny."
