A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to repeal "The Triennial Parliaments Act, 1879," and to provide otherwise for the ordinary Duration of the General Assembly in Parliament. Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Quinquennial Parliaments Act, 1887." Short Title.

2. "The Triennial Parliaments Act, 1879," is hereby repealed. Repeal.

10 3. The present House of Representatives shall, unless the General Assembly be sooner dissolved, continue to the day of _____, one thousand eight hundred and ninety. Duration of present House of Representatives.

15 4. Every future House of Representatives shall, unless the General Assembly be sooner dissolved, continue for a period of five years, to be computed from the day fixed for the return of the writs issued for choosing such House, and no longer. Elections to be quinquennial.
