### A BILL INTITULED

An Act to authorise the Construction of certain Railways. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Railways Authorisation Short Title. Act, 1902."

2. (1.) The Governor may from time to time, in the name and on Certain railways behalf of His Majesty, undertake or enter into contracts for the con- authorised. 10 struction of the railways mentioned in the Schedule hereto to the extent specified in such Schedule.

(2.) The cost of constructing such railways shall be paid out of moneys appropriated for that purpose by the General Assembly.

This Act shall be deemed to be a special Act authorising the Act to be deemed a 15 construction of such railways to the extent specified in such Schedule, special Act. within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Public Works Act," 1894," and its amendments, which Acts are, so far as applicable, hereby incorporated with this Act.

## SCHEDULE.

Schedule.

Name of Railway.	Extent authorised.
1. Helensville Northwards	An extension from a point on the southern boundary of Section 8, Block XVI., Otamatea Survey District, to Maungaturoto. Length, about twenty-three miles.
2. Gisborne–Karaka	An extension from the left bank of the Waipaoa River to Karaka. Length, about five miles and a quarter.
3. Catlin's-Seaward Bush	From Waimahaka, on the Seaward Bush Branch Railway, to connect with the extension of the Catlin's River Branch Railway, as authorised by "The Railways Authorisation Act, 1899." Length, about fifty-five miles.
