An Act to authorise the Construction of a certain Railway. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

2. The Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, Power for the Goenter into a contract or contracts for the construction of an extension of the Wellington-Napier Railway from its present terminus in into contracts for 10 Thorndon, in the City of Wellington, to a point on the Te Aro railway. reclamation, within the said city, to be hereafter determined by the Governor.
