A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Regulations Act 1936

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, 5 as follows:

- 1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Regulations Amendment Act 1962, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Regulations Act 1936* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 2. Regulations to be laid before Parliament—(1) The principal Act is hereby amended by repealing section 8 (as added by section 2 of the Regulations Amendment Act 1959), and substituting the following section:

"8. All regulations made after the commencement of this section and printed and published pursuant to this Act shall be laid before Parliament within twenty-eight days after the date of the making thereof if Parliament is then in session, and, if not, shall be laid before Parliament within twenty-eight days after the date of the commencement of the next ensuing session."

(2) The Regulations Amendment Act 1959 is hereby consequentially repealed.
