AN ACT to amend "The Road Boards Act, 1882."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

| <p>1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Road Boards Act 1882 Amendment Act, 1902," and it shall be read with and be deemed to be incorporated with "The Road Boards Act, 1882" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act").</p> | <p>Short Title.</p> |
| <p>2. In the case of every road district which at any point of its boundary adjoins a borough the provisions in the following sections shall apply.</p> | <p>Certain districts specified.</p> |
| <p>3. The Board of any such district (irrespective of the provisions of the principal Act) shall have power, at its discretion, to make and levy a rate not exceeding <i>one farthing</i> in the pound on the capital value of all rateable property within the district, for more effectively carrying out the work of sanitation within such district.</p> | <p>Power to levy rate.</p> |
| <p>4. Such rate shall be made, levied, and collected at the same time and in the same manner as the general rate for the district, but no subsidy from the Consolidated Fund shall be payable thereon.</p> | <p>Date of making rate.</p> |
| <p>5. For the purposes of this Act, sanitation (without limiting the meaning of the term) shall be regarded as including the removal of house and factory refuse; the purchase and use and distribution of disinfectants; the cleansing of closets, privies, and cesspools not connected with any public drain; the construction and maintenance of public urinals; the removal of nightsoil, and the purchase of land (either within or without the road district) as a depot for its disposal.</p> | <p>Sanitation.</p> |
