## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to relieve Returning Officers from responsibility Title. in certain cases.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the continuous follows :--

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Returning Officers Short Title. 5 Act, 1874."

2. The parts of clauses of Acts mentioned in the Schedule hereto,

are hereby repealed.

3. No Returning Officer at any election of a member of the Returning or Pre-House of Representatives, or Superintendent of any province not 10 established under "The New Provinces Act, 1858," or of a member of any Provincial Council, nor any officer or person presiding at any election under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," shall vote at such election.

4. Whenever the votes of two or more candidates at any such 15 election, of whom a less number only can be elected, shall be equal, the name of each of such candidates shall be written in full on a card; and such cards, with a name on each, shall at the time appointed for declaring the result of the election be placed by the Returning Officer in a box or bag, so that they shall not be visible; and such one of the <sup>20</sup> candidates having equal votes as shall be first in alphabetical order, or if he shall decline the next in alphabetical order, or if one of such candidates only shall be present such one candidate, shall draw forth one of such cards and deliver it to the Returning or Presiding Officer, who shall declare the person named thereon to be the person or one of the persons duly elected, and so on, if requisite, until the number required to complete the number to be elected shall be drawn and named; but if no such candidate shall be present, or every such candidate present shall decline to act, the Returning or Presiding Officer shall draw forth such card or cards.
