A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Rating on Unimproved Value Act, 1896." Title.

WHEREAS prior to the passing of "The Local Government Voting
 5 Reform Act, 1899," proposals for the adoption of "The Rating on
 Unimproved Value Act, 1896," have been defeated in certain
 localities because of the restriction as to the required majority
 which by the said first-recited Act has been repealed: And whereas
 it is expedient to enable a fresh poll to be taken in such localities
 10 without the delay at present by law prescribed: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Rating on Unimproved
 15 Value Act Amendment Act, 1900." Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Rating on
 Unimproved Value Act, 1896," in any locality where prior to the
 passing of this Act a poll has been taken on the proposal for the
 adoption of the said first-mentioned Act, and such proposal has been
 20 affirmed by a majority but has been declared rejected because such
 majority was not such as was then by law required, the like proposal
 may again be submitted to the votes of the ratepayers at any time
 after the passing of this Act, and subject to the provisions of "The
 Local Government Voting Reform Act, 1899," and of section eleven
 25 of "The Rating on Unimproved Value Act, 1896." Restriction as to
poll in certain cases
