AN ACT to remove the Disabilities of Women.

Title.

Preamble.

WHEREAS women are now possessed of equal voting powers with men, and it is desirable that equal opportunity should be given to them to serve the country in offices which they are competent to fill:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Removal of Women's Disabilities Act, 1895."

2. From and after the passing of this Act a woman may be nominated, appointed, or elected to any public office or position to which a man may be appointed or elected, any law or statute to the contrary notwithstanding.
