A BILL INTITULED

An Act to vest certain Lands in the District of Title. Roxburgh in Trustees, for the recreation of the Inhabitants of the Town of Roxburgh and surrounding District.

WHEREAS by a grant from the Crown, dated the thirtieth day of Preamble. October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the lands described in the Schedule to this Act were granted to James Macandrew, as and being Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in trust 5 for recreation purposes for the inhabitants of the Town of Roxburgh and surrounding district: And whereas it is expedient to provide for the management of the said land:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, 10 as follows:

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Roxburgh Recreation Short Title. Reserve Act, 1877."

2. The land described in the Schedule hereto shall be and is Lands vested in hereby transferred to and vested in the Mayor of the incorporated Trust. 15 Town of Roxburgh for the time being by virtue of his office, George Mackay, John Beighton, James Woodhouse, Patrick Ormond, Edward Moses Manuel, all of the District of Roxburgh, settlers, under the name of "The Roxburgh Recreation Reserve Trust;" and such Trust shall be a Corporation, and have all the powers and privileges of cor-

If any members of the said Trust shall resign, or shall be absent for twelve months from the Otago Provincial District, or shall be adjudicated a bankrupt or insolvent, or take the benefit of any Act for the relief of debtors, or shall be convicted of any felony, he shall cease to be a member of the said Trust, and the Governor may, in case of such vacancy, or in the case of the death of any member, appoint another or others in his place.

ALL that parcel of land situate in the Teviot District, being Section numbered thirty-three (33), Block two (II.), on the map of the said district, containing by admeasurement three hundred (300) acres, more or less.
