1. Short Title.

2. Non-resident of district may be declared
qualified to be elected member of Board.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to qualify a Non-resident of a District to be elected as
a Member of the Board of such District. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in
5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-
lows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Rabbit-proof Wire-
netting Fences Act 1898 Amendment Act, 1900." Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in sub-
10 section one of section eleven of "The Rabbit-proof Wire-netting
Fences Act, 1898," or elsewhere in that Act, the Governor, on the
application in writing of a majority of the ratepayers of a district
under that Act, may by notice in the *Gazette* declare any specified
15 person to be qualified to be elected as a member of the Board
of that district although such person is not a ratepayer of the
district, and in such case such person shall be deemed to be qualified
accordingly. Non-resident of
district may be
declared qualified
to be elected mem-
ber of Board.
