A BILL INTITULED

AN Act to amend "The School Attendance Act, 1901," hereinafter referred to as the said Act. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The School Attendance Act 1901 Amendment Act, 1902." It shall form part of and be read together with "The Education Act, 1877." Short Title.

2. If upon the hearing of any charge for a breach of any of the provisions of sections three and six of the said Act the parent does not produce a certificate of exemption under sections four or five of the said Act, but the Court is nevertheless satisfied, after hearing the evidence on oath of the parent or parents and any other person or witness, that it is inexpedient, having regard to the special circumstances of the case, to inflict a fine, the Court may dismiss the information. In certain cases Court may dismiss information.
