A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Shearers' Accommodation Act, 1919.	Title.
BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—	
1. This Act may be cited as the Shearers' Accommodation Amendment Act, 1925, and shall be read together with and be deemed part of the Shearers' Accommodation Act, 1919.	Short Title.
2. (1.) Section six of the Shearers' Accommodation Act, 1919, is hereby amended by adding to paragraph (a) the following words: "and the dining-room shall be adequately provided with tables and seating-accommodation. Under no circumstances shall any person sleep in the dining-room."	Section 6 of Shearers' Accommodation Amendment Act, 1919, amended.
(2.) The said section is hereby further amended by adding the following new paragraphs:—	
(h.) Proper washing and bathing facilities shall be provided, including an ample supply of hot and cold water, and a washhouse and copper.	
(i.) Under no circumstances shall a killing-pen be less than three hundred yards from the dining and sleeping quarters. Killing-pens shall have concrete floors, and shall be provided with an adequate water-supply and fly-proof safes.
