A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Shearers' and Agricultural Labourers' Title. Accommodation Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as

1. This Act may be cited as the Shearers' and Agricultural Short Title. Labourers' Accommodation Amendment Act, 1912, and shall form part of and be read together with the Shearers' and Agricultural 10 Labourers' Accommodation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the

principal Act).

2. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in section twelve of the section 12 of principal Act, where an agricultural labourer resides in a house which principal Act modified. is owned or leased by his employer, other than the private residence 15 of the employer, and whether or not the agricultural labourer pays rent for the same or any sum is deducted from his wages by way of rent, the employer shall provide such accommodation as is prescribed by regulations made in that behalf.

(2.) Such regulations may distinguish between the accommoda-20 tion to be provided in cases where a house is occupied exclusively by a married man and his family and the accommodation to be

provided in the case of other agricultural labourers.

3. Section thirteen of the principal Act is hereby amended by Section 13 of inserting, after the words "sanitary condition" in subsection one, the principal Act 25 words "and for providing a convenient, adequate, and wholesome water-supply "; and by omitting the words "two hundred and forty" from the same subsection, and substituting the words "three hundred

4. The provisions of the principal Act and this Act shall extend Principal Act 30 and apply to workers at sawmills in the same manner as they apply extend d to sawmill workers. to agricultural labourers.
