A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The School Attendance Act, 1901." BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The School Attendance Act, Short Title. 1904"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The School Attendance Act, 1901" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act").

The notice required by section six of the principal Act to be Service of notice 10 given to the parent of a child, requiring him to send such child to school, may be given to the parent by delivering it to him personally, or by leaving it for him at his house with any inmate thereof appearing to be above the age of fourteen years, or by posting it by regis-
- 15 tered letter addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode.

20 the production to the Court by the Truant Officer, or other authorised person taking the proceedings, of the attendance roll of the school in which the child is enrolled shall be sufficient evidence of the fact that the child is enrolled at such school, and of the number of 25attendances of such child during any period covered by the roll.
