A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:---

1. This Act may be cited as the Shops and Offices Amend-Short Title. ment Act, 1929, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. (1) In this section the term "special day" means a day referred Special provision as to in subsection one of section twenty-six of the principal Act, and to compliance with statutory closing-day

"award holiday" means a holiday provided for by any award.

(2) The requirements of the principal Act as to the statutory closingday, or observance of a weekly half-holiday, in shops shall be deemed to principal Act in 15 have been complied with in relation to any shop in any week if that shop has, in that week, been closed for two working-days, being special days or award holidays as hereinbefore defined, or being one special day and one award holiday.

(3) Subsection three of section twenty-six of the principal Act and Ropeals. section eleven of the Shops and Offices Amendment Act, 1927, are hereby consequentially repealed.

3. Section thirty of the principal Act is hereby amended as Section 30 of follows :--

(a) By adding the following proviso:—

"Provided that if an Inspector, in accordance with the provisions of the next succeeding subsection, dispenses with the requirement as to separate entrances, the several classes of business shall be deemed to be carried on in different shops at all times while such dispensation continues in force."

(b) By adding the following subsections:—

"(2) For the purposes of the last preceding subsection an Inspector may, by writing under his hand, dispense with the requirement as to separate entrances in any case if, in his opinion, the provision of such separate entrances is impracticable in the circumstances of that case, and is not essential as a means of ensuring that the several classes of business will be carried on in compliance with the law.

"(3) If the occupier of a shop in respect of which an Inspector grants any dispensation as aforesaid is sub- 10 sequently convicted under this Act of any offence in relation to the closing of such shop or of any subdivision thereof, such dispensation shall be suspended by the Magistrate for

such period as he thinks fit."

Section 33 of principal Act amended.

4. Section thirty-three of the principal Act is hereby amended as 15 follows:

(a) By inserting in subsection one, before the words "the goods."

the words "or any of."

(b) By omitting from subsection two all words after the word and substituting the words "prohibit the sale, in 20 the said district during such times, to be stated in the notice, as the shops in such trade are required to be closed as aforesaid, of such goods as are specified in the notice."

(c) By repealing subsection three, and substituting the following

subsection:

"(3) While any such notice remains in force it shall be an offence to sell any goods specified therein during the

times specified therein.'

Section 66 of principal Act amended.

5. Subsection two of section sixty-six of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding the words "and in addition may at all reasonable 30 times inspect any part of the premises in or on which a shop is situated if he has reason to suspect or believe that goods belonging to the occupier of such shop are kept for sale in or on such part, and that such part is in the occupation of the occupier of such shop or that he has a right or leave to enter therein or thereon."
