A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867." Title. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Salmon and Trout Act Short Title. 1867 Amendment Act, 1886."

2. It shall be lawful for any person to use stake-nets, but no Stake-nets may be other nets, for the purpose of taking indigenous fish only from the used for taking River Taieri and the Lakes Waihola and Waipori, in the Provincial River Taieri and District of Otago, anything contained in any Act, or in any regulations Lakes Waihola and Waipori. made under any Act, to the contrary notwithstanding.
