2. Stake-nets may be used for taking indigenous fish from River Taieri and Lakes Waihola and Waipori.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Salmon and Trout Act, 1867."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Salmon and Trout Act 1867 Amendment Act, 1886."

Short Title.

2. It shall be lawful for any person to use stake-nets, but no other nets, for the purpose of taking indigenous fish only from the River Taieri and the Lakes Waihola and Waipori, in the Provincial District of Otago, anything contained in any Act, or in any regulations made under any Act, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Stake-nets may be used for taking indigenous fish from River Taieri and Lakes Waihola and Waipori.
