## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to make Provision for the Observance of the Title. Birthday of His Majesty King George the Sixth.

WHEREAS His Majesty King George the Sixth was Preamble.
5 graciously pleased to approve of the general observance of His birthday in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-seven on the ninth day of June instead of the fourteenth day of December of that year: And whereas His Majesty has further been graciously pleased to 10 approve of the observance in New Zealand of His birthday on the first Monday in June in every subsequent year of His reign: And whereas legislation is necessary in order that full effect may be given to His Majesty's pleasure in the matter of the observance of His 15 birthday:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Sovereign's Birthday short Title. 20 Observance Act, 1937.

Date of observance of birthday of His Majesty King George the Sixth.

2. (1) Where in any Act, award, industrial agreement, or other agreement, or in any order of any Court or in any other instrument of authority in force on the ninth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, reference is or was made to the Sovereign's birthday, such reference, unless inconsistent with the context, shall in respect of that year be deemed to have been to the said date, and not to the fourteenth day of December.

(2) Where in any award, industrial agreement, or other agreement, or in any order of any Court or 10 other instrument of authority that has come into force since the ninth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, or that may hereafter come into force on or before the fourteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, reference is made to the 15 Sovereign's birthday, such reference, unless inconsistent with the context, shall have no application in respect of the year nineteen hundred and thirty-seven.

(3) Where in any Act, award, industrial agreement, or other agreement, or in any order of any Court or in 20 any other instrument of authority for the time being in force reference is made to the Sovereign's birthday, such reference shall in respect of every year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Sixth, subsequent to the year nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, be deemed to 25 be a reference to the first Monday in June and not to the fourteenth day of December.
