A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide for the Consolidation and Printing of the Statutes of the General Assembly of New Zealand. Title.

WHEREAS, inasmuch as all Her Majesty's lieges are amenable to the statute law: And whereas it is expedient that the entire law on any given subject should be comprised within the limits of a single statute: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Statutes Consolidation and Printing Act, 1895." Short Title.

2. Immediately after the prorogation of Parliament at this present session, and at every succeeding session, it shall be the duty of the Law Officers of the Crown to collate any amending Act passed during any such session with the original Act thereby amended, and to prepare a consolidated Act which shall incorporate the amendment or amendments made by the amending Act with the provisions of the original Act. Preparation of consolidated Act.

3. Such consolidated Act shall be submitted to a Judge of the Supreme Court, who shall be appointed to such duty by Order in Council under the authority of this Act, who shall certify whether such consolidated Act is or is not in accordance with the law as amended; and, if such Judge shall certify in the affirmative, then such consolidated statute shall be deemed and taken for all purposes whatsoever to supersede the original Act and the amending Act, and shall be printed and issued in the volume of statutes for the year instead of the amending Act or Acts.
