A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide for the Permanent Appointment of an Additional Judge of the Supreme Court. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Supreme Court Judge Appointment Act, 1900." Short Title.

2. In lieu of the sum of seven thousand seven hundred pounds granted by "The Civil List Act, 1863," for defraying the expenses of the salaries of the Judges of the Supreme Court, there is hereby substituted the sum of nine thousand two hundred pounds. Appropriation for salaries of Supreme Court Judges.

3. The said sum of nine thousand two hundred pounds shall without further appropriation than this Act be applied in paying to the Judges of the said Court respectively the annual salaries following, that is to say,— Application of moneys appropriated.

Annual salary of the Chief Justice	£1,700
Annual salaries of five puisne Judges, each one thousand five hundred pounds	7,500

Total £9,200

4. The foregoing provisions of this Act are in substitution of those contained in section two and the First Schedule of "The Civil List Act 1863 Amendment Act, 1873," and that section and Schedule are hereby accordingly repealed. Repeal.
