A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Sale of Liquor Act 1989—

(a) To allow sales of wines on Sundays by holders of wine makers' licences who hold off-licences:

(b) To allow the sale of fruit wine by supermarkets and grocery stores in respect of which an off-licence has been granted

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

- 1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Sale of Liquor (Off-Licence) Amendment Act 1991, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 2. Conditions of off-licences—(1) Section 37 (1) of the principal Act is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "every off-licence", the words ", other than an off-licence granted to the holder of a wine maker's licence,".

(2) Section 37 of the principal Act is hereby further amended by inserting, after subsection (1), the following new subsection:

"(1A) It shall be a condition of every off-licence granted to the 20 holder of a wine maker's licence, that no liquor shall be sold or delivered on Good Friday or Christmas Day."

(3) Section 37 (3) of the principal Act is hereby further amended by inserting, before paragraph (a), the following

paragraph:

"(aa) Fruit wine that conforms to the standard prescribed by regulation 226 of the Food Regulations 1984 (S.R. 1984/262), or any other standard that may be prescribed pursuant to the Food Act 1981 in substitution for that standard; and".
