5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Sale of Liquor Restriction Act, Short Title. 1917.

2. On the first day of November, nineteen hundred and seventeen, and thereafter while this Act remains in force, the Licensing Act, solosing of licensed premises during to the sale of intoxicating liquor, shall, notwithstanding anything to the contrary therein, be read and construed as if the

15 following provisions were substituted for the provisions of subsection one of section one hundred and eighty-nine of the first-mentioned Act, namely,—

"Subject as hereinafter mentioned, all licensed premises shall

be closed as follows, that is to say: -

"(a.) On Saturday night, from eight o'clock until nine o'clock of the following Monday morning;

"(b.) On the nights of all other days, from eight o'clock until nine o'clock of the following morning."

3. This Act shall remain in force during the continuance of the Duration of Act. 25 present war with Germany and for six months thereafter, and no longer.
