A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.

Title

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1915, and shall form part of and be read together with the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Short Title.

2. The Governor may by Proclamation declare that any specified portion of a reserve under the principal Act shall, as from a date to be specified in the Proclamation, cease to be subject to the provisions of that Act, if such portion is deemed by the Governor to be auriferous or argentiferous, and every such Proclamation shall have effect according to its tenor.

Governor may by Proclamation remove reservation over portion of scenic reserve deemed to be auriferous or argentiferous.

3. Section six of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, is hereby amended by omitting the words "Discharges any firearm thereon," and substituting the words "Has in his possession or under his control or discharges any firearm while on any such land or."
