## A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows :--

1. This Act may be cited as the Scenery Preservation Amend- short Title. ment Act, 1915, and shall form part of and be read together with the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

10 2.
