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A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to repeal certain Enactments, and to amend and continue the Operation of certain Expiring Enactments. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Statutes Repeal and Expiring Laws Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920. Short Title.

2. (1.) The enactments mentioned in Part I of the *First* Schedule hereto (being enactments the operation of which is spent or the duration of which has expired) are hereby specifically repealed. Repeals.

(2.) The enactments mentioned in Part II of the *First* Schedule hereto are hereby repealed.

3. Section forty-one of the Finance Act, 1916, is hereby amended by repealing subsection six thereof. Extension of duration of power to issue debentures in respect of land acquired by the Crown.

4. Section thirty-one of the War Legislation Amendment Act, 1916, is hereby amended by omitting the word "twelve," and substituting the word "eighteen."

5. Section thirteen of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, is hereby amended as follows:— Extension of period of protection of certain mineral leases in Nelson Land District.

(a.) By omitting from the definition of the term "soldier" the words "or who, though not in receipt of such pay has not yet been a member of the Force for four months"; and

(b.) By repealing the definition of the term "discharged soldier," and substituting the following definition:— Amendment of provisions as to protection of discharged soldiers from ejection.

"Discharged soldier" means a person who has served beyond the seas as a member of an Expeditionary Force, and who has received his discharge from that Force, or whose appointment (in the case of an officer) has been terminated."

Duration of Treaties of Peace Act, 1919, extended.

6. Section six of the Treaties of Peace Act, 1919, is hereby repealed.

Duration of certain enactments regulating banking and rates of interest extended.

7. Section forty-eight of the Finance Act, 1916, is hereby repealed, amended by omitting the words "twelve months" and substituting the words "three years."

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Duration of certain other enactments extended.

8. (1.) The enactments mentioned in the *Second* Schedule hereto shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and *twenty-one*, and shall then expire unless further continued.

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Consequential repeals.

(2.) Subsection two of section twenty of the War Legislation Amendment Act, 1916, is hereby repealed.
