SUMMER TIME AMENDMENT (No. 2).

ANALYSIS.

Title. 1. Short Title. 2. Extending period of summer time.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Summer Time Act, 1929. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the Summer Time Short Title. Amendment Act, 1933, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Summer Time Act, 1929 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. (1) The period of summer time ending in the year 10 nineteen hundred and thirty-four or in any subsequent Extending year shall continue until the last Sunday in April in such summer time. year.

(2) The period of summer time beginning in the year

nineteen hundred and thirty-four or in any subsequent 15year shall begin on the last Sunday in September in such year.

(3) Subsection two of section two of the principal Act is hereby consequentially amended as follows:---

- (a) By omitting the words "second Sunday in 20October", and substituting the words "last Sunday in September"; and
 - (b) By omitting the words "third Sunday in March". and substituting the words "last Sunday in April".
