## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to refer the Question of the Introduction of Scripture Title. Text-books into the Public Schools of the Colony to the decision of the Householders, as defined by "The Education Act, 1877."

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Scripture Text-books short Title. in Public Schools Act, 1895."

2. The term "Scripture text-books" means "The Irish National "Scripture text-

School Books of Scripture Lessons."

3. At the annual meeting of householders in each school district Vote to be taken. under the provisions of "The Education Act, 1877," and its amendments, to be held next after the passing of this Act, there shall be 15 submitted to the vote of the householders then present the proposals set forth in the Schedule hereto.

4. The vote upon such proposals shall be taken as hereinafter How vote to be

provided, that is to say:

(a.) The Education Board for each district shall provide the Voting-papers to be various School Committees within its jurisdiction, prior to provided by Education Boards. such annual meeting as aforesaid, with a sufficient supply

of voting-papers in the form set out in the Schedule hereto; (b.) The meeting shall elect two householders present at the Scrutineers to be meeting to act as Scrutineers:

(c.) The Chairman of the meeting, with the assistance of the Chairman and said Scrutineers, shall take care that every householder that voting-papers present entitled to vote for the election of the School supplied. Committee for the ensuing year is provided with one voting-paper;

(d.) The voter shall strike out one of the proposals on the voting- How to vote. paper, and the voter shall be deemed to have voted in favour of the proposal which is not struck out;

Voting-papers to be counted, result declared by Chairman, and reported to Minister of Education.

Minister to tabulate results and notify in *Gazette*.

(e.) The said Scrutineers so appointed as aforesaid shall collect the voting-papers, and shall proceed at once to count the votes given in favour of each proposal submitted; and, after rejecting all informal votes, shall report the result to the Chairman of the meeting, who, after declaring the result of the voting, shall forthwith report the same, and forward the voting-papers to the Minister of Education.

5. The Minister of Education, on receiving from the Chairmen of the various School Committees such report and voting-papers as aforesaid, shall tabulate such results and publish the same in the 10 Gazette, and ascertain therefrom the determination of the voters throughout the colony on the proposals submitted; and if he finds that a majority of the votes recorded throughout the colony are in favour of the proposal that the lessons contained in the Scripture text-books shall form one of the subjects of instruction in the public schools of the colony, he shall forthwith notify in the Gazette that such proposal has been carried; and, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Education Act, 1877," or any amendment thereof, the lessons in the said Scripture text-books shall form one of the subjects of instruction in all the public schools of the colony, and the Minister of Education shall make provision accordingly.

If proposal carried, lessons to be given.

6. After the notification of the carrying of the proposal as aforesaid, the lessons in the said Scripture text-books shall be given daily in every public school in the colony on the day on which the same 25 shall be opened, and for and during the first thirty minutes of the first school-hour in the forenoon, and before such teaching the Lord's prayer may be repeated.

If objection made, children not compelled to be present.

Teachers' conscience clause.

7. No child shall be compelled to be present at the giving of the said lessons in the said Scripture text-books whose parent or 30 guardian shall make objection thereto in writing.

8. If any teacher shall satisfy the Education Board for the district that he or she objects, on grounds of conscience, to use the said Scripture text-books, such teacher shall be relieved from the duty, and in such case the Education Board shall make other provision for the said lessons in the said Scripture text-books being given.

Act to come into operation on 1st January, 1896.

9. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

### SCHEDULE.

EDUCATION DISTRICT OF , SCHOOL DISTRICT.

I VOTE that the lessons in the Scripture Text-books shalt form one of the subjects of instruction in all public schools of the colony.

I vote that the said lessons shall not form one of the subjects of instruction.

Directions.

The voter must strike out the proposal which it is desired shall not be given effect to.
