## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Tobacco Act, 1879."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Tobacco Act Amend- Short Title. ment Act, 1888."

2. This Act shall be read and construed with "The Tobacco Act, Act to be read and

construed with "The Tobacco Act, 1879."

3. Under such regulations as the Commissioner may make from time to time, tobacco manufactured in the colony may be exported under bond without payment of duty thereon:
