An Acr to authorize the Deposit of Trust Moneys by Trustees. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Trustee Amendment Act, 1914, Short Title. and shall form part of and be read together with the Trustee Act,

1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, "Institu- Interpretation. 10 tion" means any savings-bank, municipal corporation, building

society, investment company, or public company.

3.
