A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Tramways Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Tramways Amendment Act, 1921-22, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Tramways Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Short Title.

2. (1.) Clause nine of the Second Schedule to the principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following clause substituted therefor:—

As to revocation or variation of authorizing orders.

“9. (1.) The Governor-General in Council may from time to time revoke, amend, extend, or vary an authorizing order by a further order.

“ (2.) An application for a further order to revoke or extend an authorizing order shall be made only by the local authority empowered by such authorizing order.

“ (3.) An application for a further order to amend or vary an authorizing order may be made either by the local authority empowered by such authorizing order or by any person to whom the authority conferred by such authorizing order has been duly delegated.

“ (4.) Where any application for a further order is made by the local authority it shall be made in like manner and subject to the like conditions as the application for the original order.

“ (5.) Where an application for a further order is made by a person to whom the authority conferred by an authorizing order has been delegated, the Governor-General in Council shall, before determining the matter of such application, direct an inquiry to be made in the district to which the same relates by a Commission appointed under the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908.”
