## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to insure Provision for Testators' Families. Title. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-5 lows :--

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Testator's Family short Title. Maintenance Act, 1900."

2. Should any person die, leaving a will, and without making Deceased person's therein due adequate provision for the proper maintenance and sup- estate liable for maintenance of 10 port of his or her wife, husband, or children, the Court may at its wife, husband, or discretion on the application by or on behalf of the said wife, husband, or children, if satisfied that the said-wife, husband, or children is or are without means sufficient for their maintenance and support order that such provision as to the said Court shall seem fit shall be made 15 out of the estate of the said deceased person for the maintenance and support of his-or-her-said such wife, husband, or children: Provided that the Court may attach such conditions to the order made as it shall think fit, or may refuse to make an order in favour of any person whose character or conduct is such as in the opinion of the 20 Court to disentitle him or her to the benefit of an order under this section. "Court" means the Supreme Court or District Court, any Judge thereof, and, in the case of deceased Maoris, the Native Land Court.

3. Upon such order being made as aforesaid, the executor or Estate to be hel 25 administrator shall hold the portion of the estate comprised therein freed and discharged from the trusts and dispositions of the said will, and subject only to the provisions of the said order.
