A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to insure Provision for Testators' Families.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Testator's Family Provision out of Estate Act, 1898." Short Title.
- 2. Should any person die leaving a will, and without making therein due provision for the maintenance and support of his or her wife, husband, or children, the Supreme Court may, on application made to it by or on behalf of the said wife, husband, or children, order that such provision as to the said Court shall seem fit shall be made out of the estate of the said deceased person for the maintenance and support of his or her said wife, husband, or children. Deceased person's estate liable for maintenance and support of wife, husband, or children.
- 3. Upon such order being made as aforesaid the executor or administrator shall hold the portion of the estate comprised therein freed and discharged from the trusts and dispositions of the said will, and subject only to the provisions of the said order. Estate to be held subject to order.
