A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to enable the Governor to sell a certain Title. Parcel of Land in the Town of Timaru, at present used as a site for Post and Telegraph Offices.

WHEREAS the parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto was Preamble. heretofore set apart as a site for post and telegraph offices: And whereas the said land is no longer required for any public purpose, and it is expedient that the same should be sold :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New 5 Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Timaru Post and short Title. Telegraph Offices Site Sale Act, 1878."

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor, whenever he shall think Power to Governor. 10fit, to sell and dispose of, by public auction, either together or in lots,

the said parcel of land described in the said Schedule. **3.** The Governor, in the name and on behalf of Iler Majesty, Grants may be may make and execute, under the Public Seal of the Colony, a Crown issued 15 grant or grants in the usual form to the purchaser or purchasers of

the said land, and such grant or grants shall be deemed to convey an estate in fee-simple, free from incumbrances.

4. The proceeds to arise from any such sale shall, after payment Proceeds of sale how thereout of the expenses attending the sale, be applied by the Governor to be applied. 20 in and towards the building of new post and telegraph offices elsewhere in the said Town of Timaru.
