A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to limit the Issue of Totalisator Permits in New Zealand. Title. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Totalisator Permits short Title. Limitation Act, 1906."

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Gaming and Reduction of Lotteries Act, 1881," or "The Gaming Act, 1894," it shall not be permits.

10 lawful for the Colonial Secretary to grant in any one year, after the passing of this Act, more than two-thirds of the number of licenses authorising the use of the totalisator that were issued in the twelve months commencing on the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and five, and ending on the thirty-first day of July, one 15 thousand nine hundred and six.

3. No permit for the use of the totalisator shall be issued by Permit for one day which the totalisator can be used for more than one day, and only. separate permits shall be required for any second, third, or other day.

4. No permit whatever shall be issued which allows the use of No permits for use 20 the totalisator at any place in the colony on any one of the thirteen on bank holidays. days set forth in the Schedule of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1902."
