# A BILL INTITULED

An Act to abolish the Use of the Totalisator and providing for a Title. Submission of such Bill to a Referendum Poll.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:--

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Totalisator-abolition Short Title. Referendum Act, 1904."

Interpretation.

2. In this Act,—

"Totalisator" means the instrument known as the totalisator, and includes every machine or instrument of a like kind or conducted upon the like principle.

3. Sections forty-six and forty-seven of "The Gaming and Repeal. Lotteries Act, 1881," sections three to six of "The Stamp Acts 15 Amendment Act, 1891," and section six of "The Gaming Act, 1894,"

are hereby repealed.

This Act shall be read together with "The Gaming and Lotteries To be read together Act, 1881," and "The Gaming Act, 1894."

with other Acts. passed the same, shall be transmitted to the Governor by the Clerk of Parliaments.

4. Within seven days after the close of the session a copy of Copy of Bill to be 20 this Bill, certified as correct by the Speaker of each House that transmitted to Governor.

5. Forthwith upon receipt of such copy the Governor shall Governor to fix cause the same to be published in the Gazette, and in the same date for poll. 25 Gazette he shall appoint a day for the taking of a poll of electors thereon.

6. The day so appointed shall be not sooner than twenty-eight When poll to be nor later than *ninety* days after the close of this session.

Bill to be posted for public inspection.

7. A copy of this Bill shall be posted for public inspection in every post-office in the colony in a conspicuous place for fourteen days before the taking of the poll.

Poll to be taken as in case of general election.

8. Subject to the provisions of this Act, such poll shall be taken in each electoral district in the colony by the same Returning Officer, at the same polling-places, and in the same manner as in the case of a general election, and the provisions of "The Electoral Act, 1902," in so far as they are applicable, shall, mutatis mutandis, apply accordingly.

Form of votingpapers.

9. For the purpose of such poll the voting-papers shall be in the 10 Form A in the Schedule hereto or to that effect.

Result of poll to be certified.

10. The result of the poll in each electoral district shall be duly certified by the Returning Officer in the Form B in the Schedule hereto or to that effect, and he shall forward the same to the Clerk of Writs.

Results to be tabulated, declared, and gazetted.

as to Bill.

11. (1.) Forthwith upon receipt of the results of the poll in every electoral district the Clerk of Writs shall prepare and gazette a tabulated statement thereof showing for each electoral district, and for the whole colony, the total number of votes recorded for and against the Bill, and the total number of informal votes; and shall 20 declare the Bill to be approved or disapproved by the referendum accordingly as the majority of all the valid votes recorded throughout the colony is recorded for or against the Bill.

(2.) Such statement and declaration shall be in the Form C in

the Schedule hereto or to that effect.

12. With respect to the referendum, the following provisions shall apply :—

Effect of referendum

(a.) Until the gazetting of the result of the poll, the Bill shall remain in the custody of the Clerk of Parliaments, and shall not be transmitted to the Governor.

(b.) If the Bill is approved by the referendum, then forthwith on the gazetting of the result of the poll the Bill shall be deemed to be for all purposes a Bill duly passed by the General Assembly in Parliament assembled in pursuance of the Constitution Act, and shall be treated and dealt 35 with accordingly.

(c.) If the Bill is disapproved by the referendum, it shall be deemed to be a Bill rejected by Parliament, and shall be

treated and dealt with accordingly.

Limit of time for second referendum.

13. With respect to the referendum the following provisions 40 shall apply:—

(a.) It shall not be again submitted for a period of three years after the gazetting of the result of the poll taken on the first submission unless at least twenty thousand electors on the electoral rolls at the date of the taking of 45 the poll so request by petition to Parliament.

14. The Governor may by Order in Council gazetted make such regulations as he deems necessary for the proper taking of the poll under this Act, and generally for giving effect to this Act.

## FORM A.
