BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Ne Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authorit of the same, as follows:—	
1. This Act may be cited as the Tomato-garder Registration Act, 1933, and shall come into force on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-four.	
2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,— "Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture: "Occupier" means the person by whom or o whose behalf any tomato-garden is actuall	on .

5. Payment of registration fees to Deposit Account in Consolidated

"Tomato-garden" means any land (whether within a glasshouse or not) used for the growing of tomato-plants and the production of tomatoes for commercial purposes. Two or more tomato-

gardens occupied and used as such by the same occupier shall be deemed to be one tomatogarden for the purposes of this Act.

Application of

3. This Act shall apply to every tomato-garden in which on the first day of January in any year there are more than two hundred and fifty tomato-plants, but shall not apply to any other tomato-garden.

Annual registration of tomato-gardens.

4. (1) Every tomato-garden to which this Act applies in any year is hereby required to be registered for that year in accordance with the provisions of this Act and of 10 regulations thereunder.

(2) Application for the registration of a tomato-garden shall be made by the occupier thereof in the prescribed form, and every such application shall be accompanied by the appropriate fee as specified in the Schedule 15 hereto.

(3) If the occupier of any tomato-garden to which this Act applies fails to make application for the registration thereof and to pay the appropriate fee on or before the thirty-first day of January in any year, he shall be 20 liable on summary conviction to a fine of five pounds, and to a further fine of ten shillings for every week that elapses after the said thirty-first day of January and before application for registration is duly made and the appropriate fee is paid.

(4) If any person becomes the occupier of an unregistered tomato-garden to which this Act applies in any year he shall make application for the registration thereof and shall pay the appropriate fee within the month of January in that year or within fourteen days after he has 30 become the occupier (whichever period is the later to expire), and if he fails so to do he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five pounds, and to a further fine of ten shillings for every week that elapses after the said period and before application for registration is duly 35 made and the appropriate fee is paid.

5. All moneys received by way of registration fees pursuant to this Act shall be paid into the Consolidated Fund to the credit of a Deposit Account. The expenses of collection and of administration, as determined by the 40 Minister, shall be deducted from the proceeds of such fees, and shall, without further appropriation than this section, be paid to the credit of the appropriate fund or account.

Payment of registration fees to Deposit Account in Consolidated Fund, and deduction of expenses.

6. The residue of the registration fees received pursuant Application of to this Act, after making the deduction provided for in registration fees. the last preceding section, shall, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without further appropriation than 5 this section, be paid to the Dominion Council of Tomato, Soft Fruit, and Produce Growers, Limited (being a society incorporated under the Industrial and Provident See Reprint of Societies Act, 1908), to be expended by it for such Statutes, Vol. III, p. 1029 purposes, in furtherance of the interests of the tomato-10 growers of New Zealand, as the Minister may approve.

7. The Governor-General may from time to time, by Regulations. Order in Council, make regulations for any of the following purposes:-

(a) For the registration of tomato-gardens:
