## A BILL INTITULED

# An Act to amend the Unclaimed Moneys Act 1908

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, 5 as follows:

- 1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Unclaimed Moneys Amendment Act 1958, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Unclaimed Moneys Act 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 10 **2. Delegation of Minister's powers**—(1) The principal Act is hereby amended by inserting, after section eight, the following section:
- "8A. (1) The Minister may from time to time, either generally or particularly, by writing under his hand delegate 15 to the Commissioner of Inland Revenue the power conferred on the Minister by section eight of this Act to pay to any claimant any money paid into the Public Account under this Act, not exceeding the sum of fifty pounds in the case of any one claimant.
- 20 "(2) Where the Commissioner purports to act pursuant to any delegation under this section, he shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be presumed to be acting in accordance with the terms of the delegation.
- "(3) Every delegation under this section shall be revocable 25 in writing at will, and no such delegation shall prevent the exercise of the power by the Minister.

"(4) Every such delegation shall, until it is revoked, continue in force according to its tenor, notwithstanding that the Minister may have ceased to hold office, and shall continue to have effect as if made by his successor in office."

(2) Section nine of the principal Act is hereby amended as

(a) By inserting, after the word "Minister" where it first occurs, the words "or, as the case may be, the Commissioner of Inland Revenue":
