A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT enabling Nurses admittedly qualified as Nurses or Midwives, but who are unregistered on Account of not having had the Provisions of the Acts of 1901 and 1904 brought under their Notice in due Time, to be registered, and for the Purpose of restoring the Licenses of those holding Private-hospitals Licenses prior to 1906.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Unregistered Nurses Registration Act, 1914.

2. Nurses who were qualified to register under the provisions of the Nurses Registration Act, 1901 (section five of which is hereby amended so far as that section provides that no certificate shall be issued after the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and two) shall be registered on the passing into law of this Act, and shall enjoy all the privileges they would have enjoyed had they registered under the provisions of the Act cited herein.

3. Midwives who were qualified to register under the Midwives Act of 1904 shall be registered on the passing into law of this Act, and shall enjoy all the privileges they would have enjoyed if they had registered under the provisions of the Act cited herein.

4. Holders of private-hospital licenses, and who by such licenses were deemed to be qualified for conducting private hospitals by holding licenses therefor prior to the passing of the Private Hospitals Act of 1906, shall have their licenses restored on the passing of this Act into law.
